We see God preparing Ugandan leaders to transform their country!


Andrew & Terry will host transformational leaders at their home during October and November

PRAY FOR UGANDA

Although surrounded by civil and political unrest, Uganda has remained relatively stable for decades. Today we see discontentment in a young population which could be leading to unrest.



Uganda has been relatively stable for decades now. With the president Museveni in power for more than 30 years there has been peace and people have been able to raise their families without the threat of violence that is witnessed in many neighbouring countries.

Uganda's mean age is less than 16. Most of this very young population have never known war and feel they do not have a voice in todays political system. As a result, we are seeing more clashes between existing leaders and this young unsatisfied population.

As a 72 year old President, Museveni's complete influence and control over Uganda begins to develop cracks. It is reliably reported that he works hard and cares deeply about Uganda but that key advisers may be exerting pressures that he now finds hard to resist. Governance may be focusing more on control today than on providing peace and prosperity for the population.

With no visible succession plan, it now seems a real possibility that civil unrest could accompany political change when it eventually arrives. Join us and pray for the rise of transformational leaders in Uganda today!
