Stellah has been working faithfully to develop her small hocking business so she can support her family. Each day she bundles up dozens of children outfits and walks door-to-door selling them. From these sales, Stellah pays her rent and provides simple foods for her 4 children.

Stellah had a dream of learning to sew and felt this could help her improve her business. After proving herself to be hard working, we paid her landlord to teach her to sew. This was an exciting time for Stellah and she started producing her own children's clothes to sell.

Just before Christmas, Stellah was given her own sewing machine, complete with thread and material and scissors and all the things she needed to make and mend clothes. This had been a dream of Stellahs for some time. Stellah has already made and sold 5 or 6 children's outfits. Her dream has combined with her small business to make her family more secure.

COVID lockdowns have complicated this here as parents (mostly single mothers) find they loose even this humble work they had during normal times. This Christmas, our family teamed up with friends in Canada to provide a feast for each of the 4 families we have been working with. We took a bucket of food like the one pictured here to each household on the 23rd. The glowing smiles of the children and thanks from the moms was amazing. This was a feast they would never have been able to provide themselves.

SLOW PROGRESS

As you likely know, we are trying to complete the kids Canadian citizenship now. This is the final step before we can all come home to Canada to visit family and friends. To complete this process, we need birth and adoption certificates for the kids and then passports. We began working on the certificates many months ago, but every time NIRA (the government agency that issues the certificates) would print the certs they would spell something incorrectly or make a mistake and use the mothers name in place of the father. Months and months passed and they had printed the certs wrong at least 5 times. Finally just before Christmas our paid advocate finally typed the details into the NIRA computer himself.

We are pleased to announce that we now have birth and adoption certificates for both children. We are now working on Ugandan passports.
